Who hopes? I would have poured my spirit without stint. In Insensibility he curses "dullards" who "cease feeling" and "make themselves immune to pity" Insensibility 32, l. In Strange Meeting the ghost of the German soldier lifts "distressful hands as if to bless" the man who killed him and calls him "my friend" 35, l.

Chaos and drudgery are common themes throughout the poem, displayed in its form. It may be a chimerical and an ignominious principle, but there it is.
